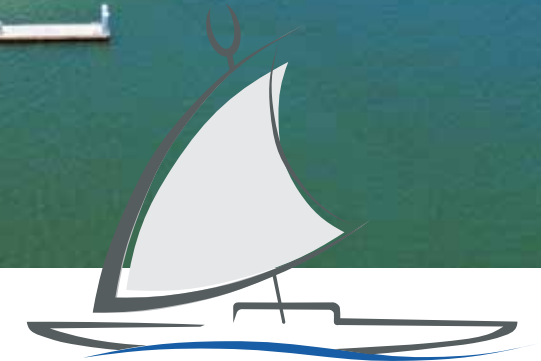
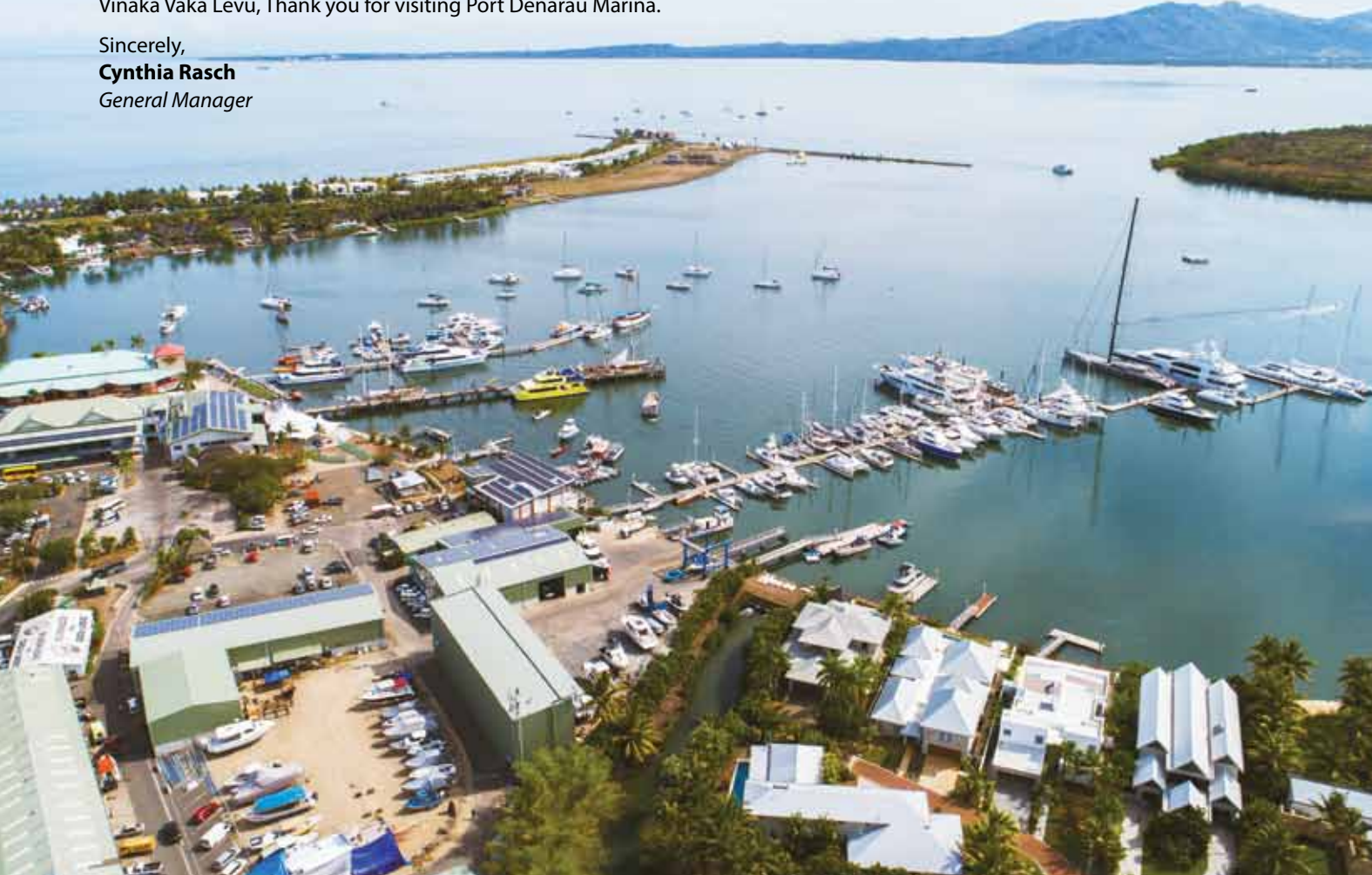

Only 20 minutes drive from Nadi International Airport, Port Denarau Marina is Fiji's premier marina facility. As the hub of the integrated Denarau Island Resort, Port Denarau Marina is the gateway to exploring our idyllic sun drenched tropical isles of Fiji's West Coast.

Port Denarau Marina is a Port of Entry which allows us to clear vessels into the marina. Please complete C2C/ Advanced Arrival Notification 48 hours prior to arrival and forward to Fiji Revenue & Customs Service.

Provisioning is easy – with a supermarket, pharmacy and bakery at the end of the dock and Nadi and Namaka only a short bus or taxi ride away.

Port Denarau Marina is walking distance to several international hotels, offering a vast array of recreational pursuits including an international 18-hole golf course – not to mention, being part of the largest retail/restaurant complex in the Nadi area.

Port Denarau is ideally positioned to provide a stopover for rest, recreation and provisioning during your cruising of the Fijian Islands.

The fast developing marina complex is the center of yachting activity in Fiji. Located on Denarau Island, it is accessed through a well-marked channel that is 5 meters deep at zero tide. The marina is well protected from all weather. The basin contains 56 fully serviced berths and 16 swing moorings including 20 berths capable of taking Superyachts up to 85 meters in length with 5 meters draft. Fuel, water, single and three-phase power and wifi are all available at the dock.

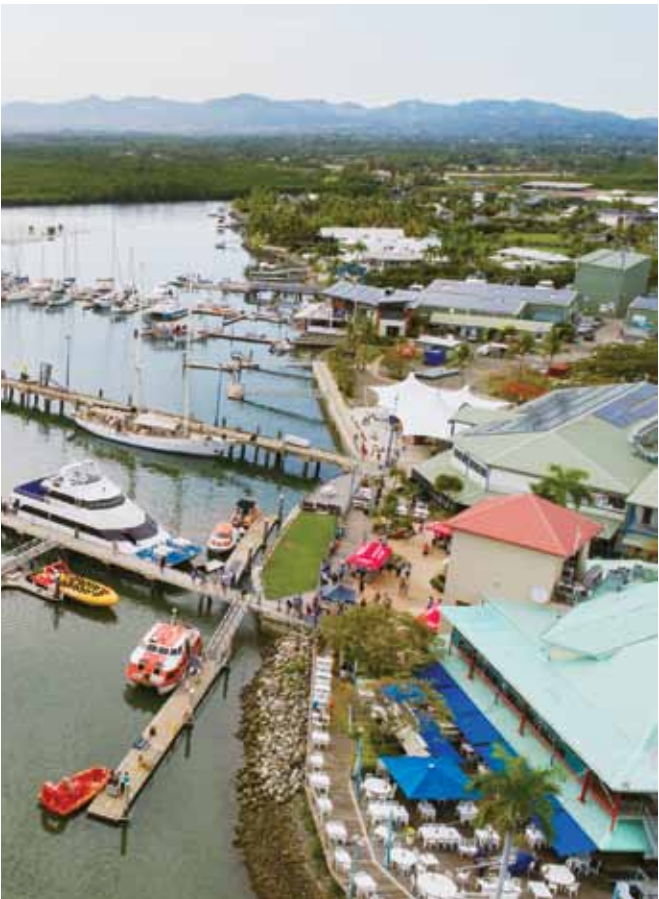
Part of Skeggs Group Ltd, a private company based in New Zealand, the complex contains a 50 tonne travel lift, a hardstand area and marine workshops. Port Denarau Marina is by far Fiji's newest haul out facility and provides the latest up to date equipment.

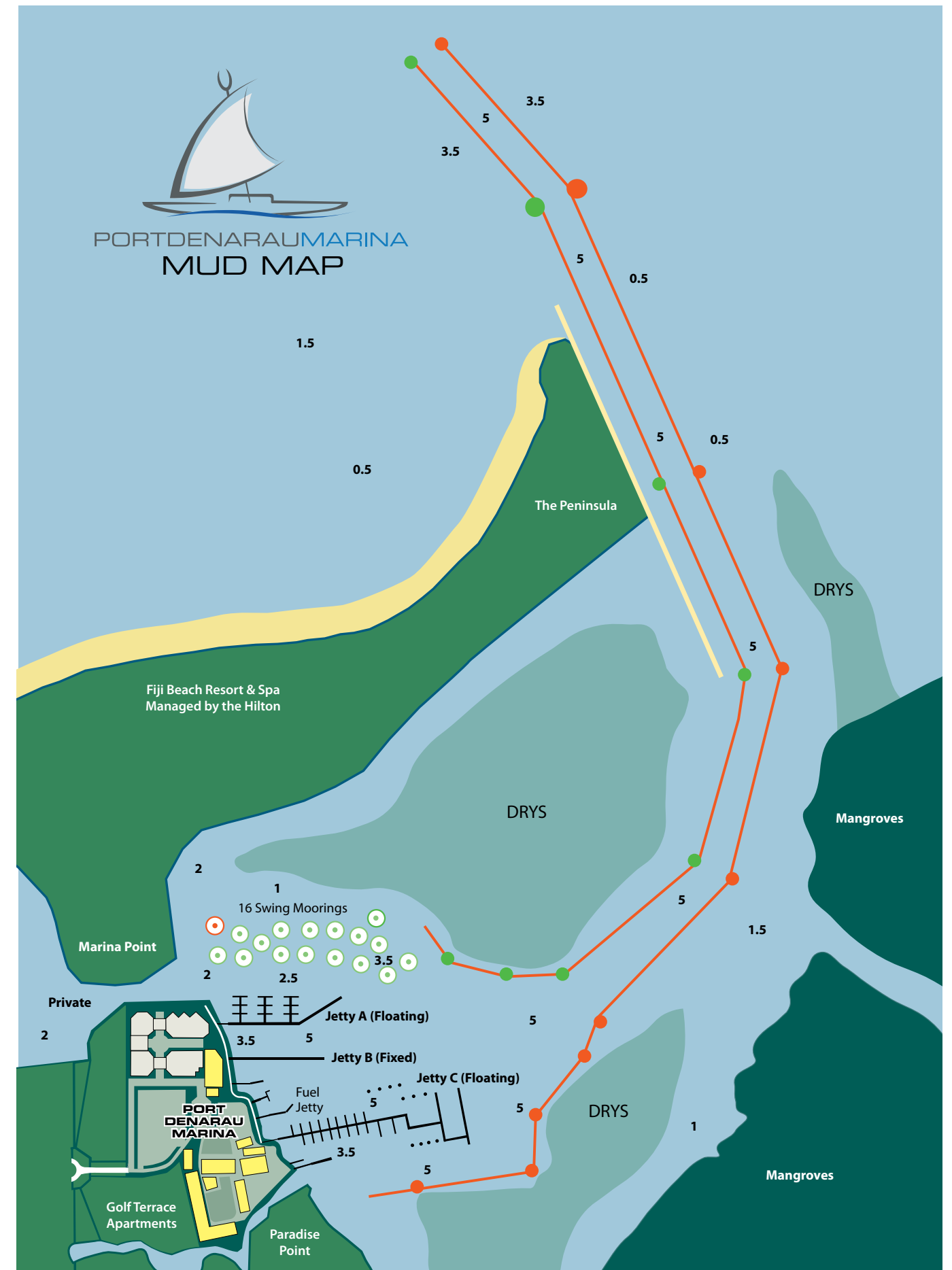

ENTERING THE MARINA

By sea we are half way between Momi passage and Lautoka.
Port Denarau Marina is accessed through a well-marked channel that is 5 meters deep at zero tide. The channel is clearly marked by floating buoys with lights.





PRIVATE BERTHING

Port Denarau Marina's private berth marina - "C Jetty" boasts 56 dedicated finger berths up to 85m with 5m draft at low water. C Jetty has transformed Fiji from a subsidiary part of New Zealand or Australia's cruising grounds into a destination in its own right. This marina has a swipe card access restricted area that provides vessels with on the dock water, single and three phase 50hz electricity. WiFi Internet is also available on all berths. If you prefer the privacy of a mooring – we have 16 swing moorings throughout the marina basin.



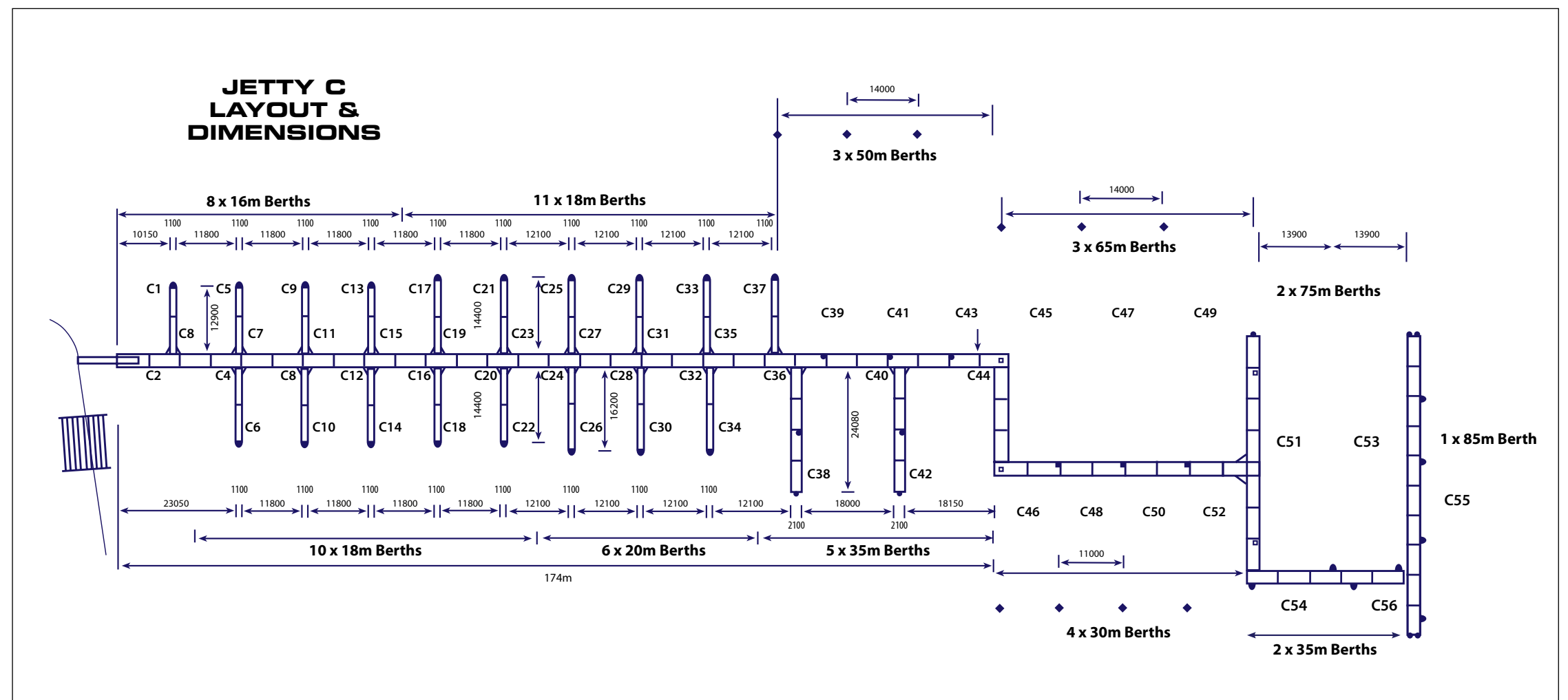
SUPERYACHTS

Until 2009, Superyachts have chosen to cruise Fiji waters relatively alone, with little infrastructure in place to accommodate the vessel and any charters. Port Denarau Marina is a superyacht destination in its own right. Over the last three years considerable modifications have been made to the marina, including the addition of a brand new Bellingham Marine floating jetty for visiting craft. Port Denarau Marina is paving the way for Superyacht owners and guests to enjoy the very best of all that Fiji has to offer from this conveniently located, luxury marina destination.

PORT DENARAU MARINA LEVEL 3 CLEAN MARINA AND FISH FRIENDLY ACCREDITED

Fiji is a country consisting of over 330 islands scattered across over 140,000 square nautical miles of ocean.

Boating is crucial to both transportation and tourism and continues to increase in popularity, making it vital that boaties understand the potential impact they can have on our unique marine environment, and are environmentally friendly in the way they operate and maintain their vessels.

Port Denarau Marina was the first marina in the South Pacific to be accredited Level 3 Clean Marina and Fish Friendly status by Marina Industries Association (MIA).

As a boat owner or operator, you want to enjoy healthy, safe and pristine waters. Pollutants can enter the ocean from a wide range of sources, including chemical, oil, fuel, and sewage discharges from both commercial and recreational boats. Additionally, dirty boat hulls have the potential to carry and spread often harmful marine pest species.

The marina has a Best Management Practices booklet which contains information on the spreading of marine pests, how to keep hitchhiking pests off your boat, emergency planning, petroleum control, sewage and gray water, storm water management, waste containment and disposal and boater education.

You can download our Best Management Practices from our website or request for a copy from the Marina Office and become an active steward of our marine environment by implementing these simple practices.

By adopting the simple clean boating habits outlined within the booklet, you can help improve fish habitat and species protection within the marina and protect our oceans for future generations to enjoy as you do today.

SEA MERCY FIJI



Remote Island Service Delivery Platform

Sea Mercy is a US and Fiji based non-profit charity organization with a mission to “stand in the gap” with service delivery vessels, trained health volunteers, support equipment, and critical care services as island nations develop their “outer island” infrastructures. Due to distance and a lack of service delivery vessels, there is a huge disparity between the services offered on the primary islands, to those available on the remote islands. Working directly with our island nation partner’s health ministries and leadership, Sea Mercy provides free Floating Health Care Clinics (FHCC), which also serve as training and educational platforms and as disaster response vessels for these neglected remote island citizens of the South Pacific. Our goals as an NGO partner is as follows:

1. To develop effective and supportive working relationships with our island nation partners.
2. To provide and operate a Floating Health Care Clinic (FHCC) and service delivery platform for each of the 11 targeted island nations who do not have health care and disaster relief programs for their remote island citizens.
3. To deliver consistent service to the remote island citizens we serve.
4. To train our island nation partners to eventually take over the FHCC operations and funding via their own resources.



5. To engage the international health care community to volunteer and serve the people of the South Pacific.
6. To provide a platform for other educational, economic development and vital programs to be delivered.

Port Denarau Marina is very passionate about this organization not only because of the incredible programs it provides the



thousands of “at risk” remote islands in the South Pacific, but for the amazing role that the international yachting community gets to play in each program.

We would like to encourage you (and your vessel/crew) to consider playing a role (minor or major) in one or more of these incredible programs. 7 DAYS DISCOVERING MAGNIFICENT FIJI

A true tropical paradise of 333 islands, with thriving marine life and secluded beaches backed by pristine jungle, Fiji is a South Pacific idyll. From volcanic hot springs and untouched coral reefs, to cascading waterfalls and mud baths, nature here is wondrous. From deserted beaches to teeming reefs, explore breathtaking Fiji on a 7-day cruising vacation.

1. MAMANUCA ISLANDS

Depart from Port Denarau Marina with a short, 1.5-hour cruise southwest to the Mamanuca Islands, where you spend the day exploring — the snorkeling here is particularly excellent due to an abundance of soft corals and tropical fish. You will spend the night anchored in Musket Cove, near the stunning Musket Cove Resort.

2. NAVADRA & VANUA

After breakfast you can sail three hours northwest towards Navadra and Vanua. These islands have beautiful beaches and great snorkelling on their garden reefs. The beach can be accessed by tender from mid to high tide, and paddle boards or kayaks at low tide. If weather permits, you can anchor here for the night or sail one hour north for Waya Island and anchor at Yalobi Bay, which is more protected.

3. NAVITI ISLAND

Head north for 1.5 hours to Cuvu Bay on the southern end of Naviti Island, which offers a rare chance to swim with manta rays. If you visit, donations of schoolbooks and clothes are much appreciated. Continue two hours north to the Blue Lagoon near Nanuya Levu and Matakawa island.

4. INSIDE THE BLUE LAGOON

Blue Lagoon was the location of the 1980s movie by the same name, starring Brooke Shields. The snorkeling here is breathtaking and the beaches are pristine. You can anchor here for the night or move to nearby Sawa-i-lau Island, which is famous for its underwater caves; you will want to add this to your diving bucket list. The lagoon has some excellent snorkeling spots and the shell markets are worth a visit, too.

5. YASAWA-I-RA

Sail two hours north to Yasawa-i-Ra, which has one of Fiji's best beaches, Champagne Beach — a crescent of powdery white sand, an ideal spot for a barbecue. The snorkelling here is terrific, too. In the evening you can go ashore to watch a meke (a traditional Fijian dance) and kava ceremony, where it is customary to give a gift of yaqona (kava root) to the head of the village.

6 & 7. SOUTH TO PORT DENARAU MARINA

For the last two days of the trip head south to return to Port Denarau Marina. Along the way you can revisit a favourite spot or explore new coves and bays such as the beautiful Somosomo Bay on the north of Naviti Island, or Paradise Cove in the south. Both locations are within about three hours of cruising.

Back at Port Denarau Marina you can provision and make another itinerary to explore the remainder of the 300+ islands breathtaking Fiji has to offer; we know that 7 days is far too short not to fall in love with this beautiful place over and over again!

Many island schools struggle with no electricity supply or they rely on dirty and usually very inefficient diesel generators they can barely afford to run a couple of hours per day in the school and a couple in the evenings for the teachers' families. So, the kids in those schools have little or no chance of a modern education.

Its Time Foundation provides clean, free energy for lighting and computers and utterly transforms the education and life prospects for these kids. The money saved on generator fuel creates decades of cash flow to buy the computers. Schools are saving as much as 20% of their budget. Additional money for education resources comes from the teachers, who are only too happy to pay a small amount for the luxury of 24 hour power — they were paying for diesel anyway. Everyone wins.

Whilst these systems are low maintenance, **Its Time Foundation** monitors them and has established a relationship with the Fiji Government for regular checking. Helping Kids AND the Environment

Every liter of fuel saved not only equates to more educational resources for the children of Fiji, but also means that 2.45 kilograms of harmful carbon dioxide is prevented from entering the atmosphere. It's a small, but very real contribution to protecting the islands and the surrounding coral reefs from the effects of climate change.
